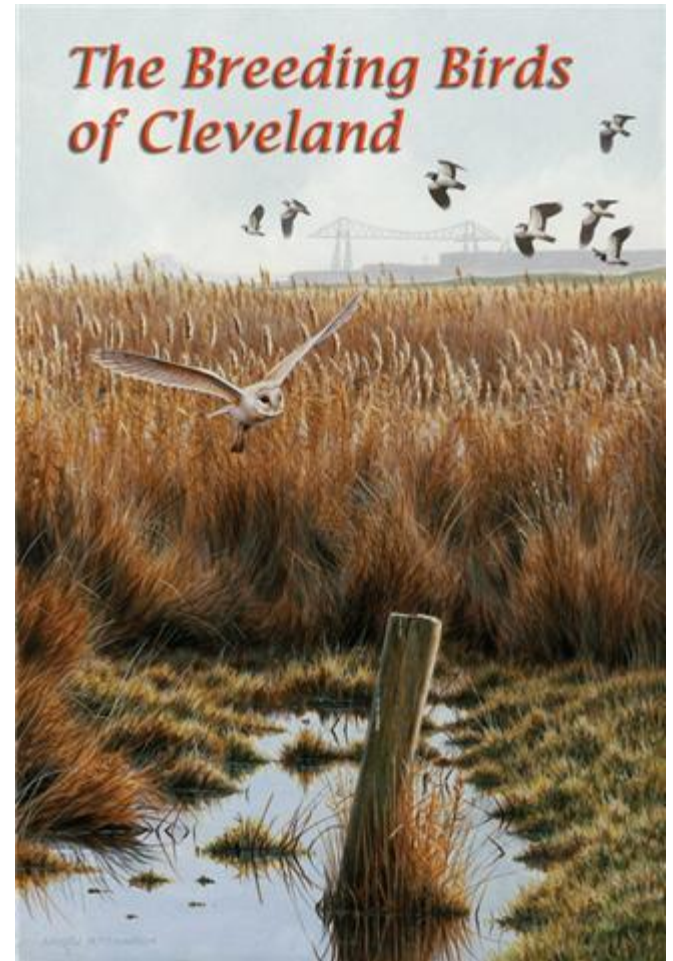
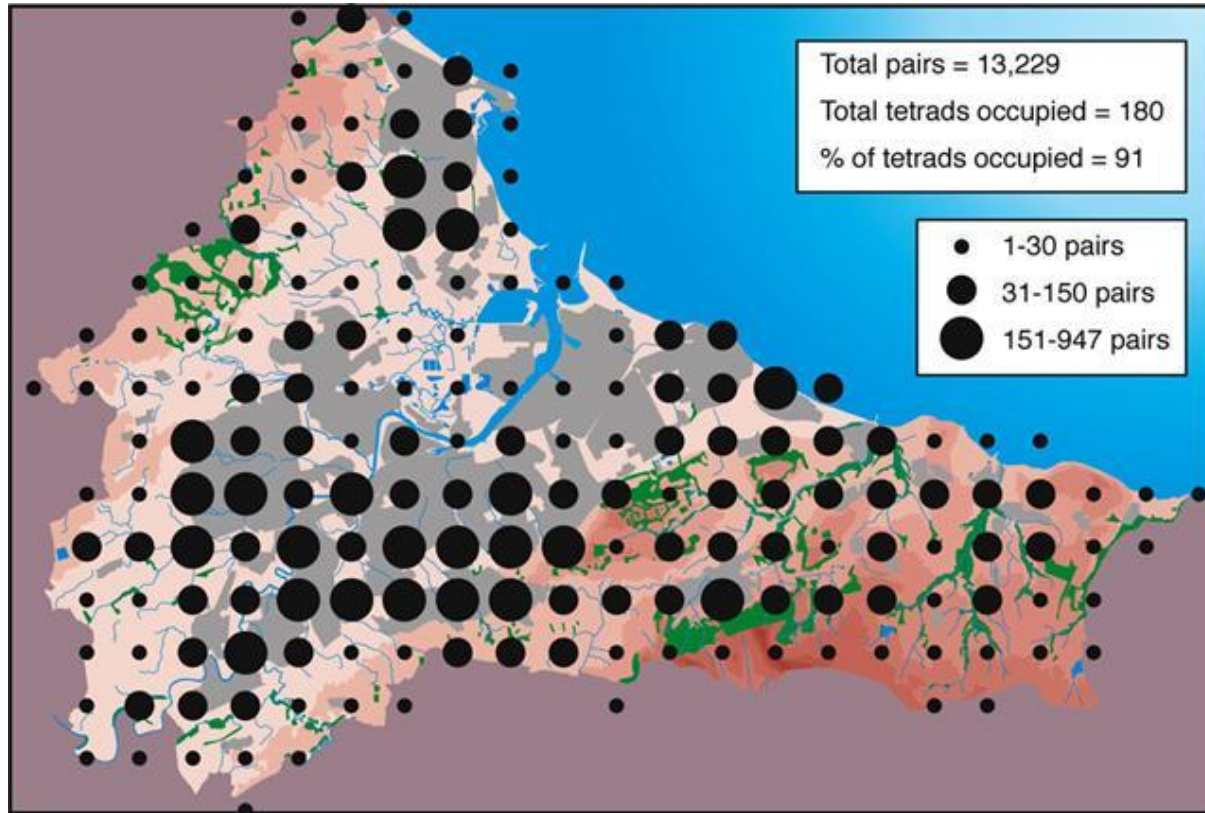

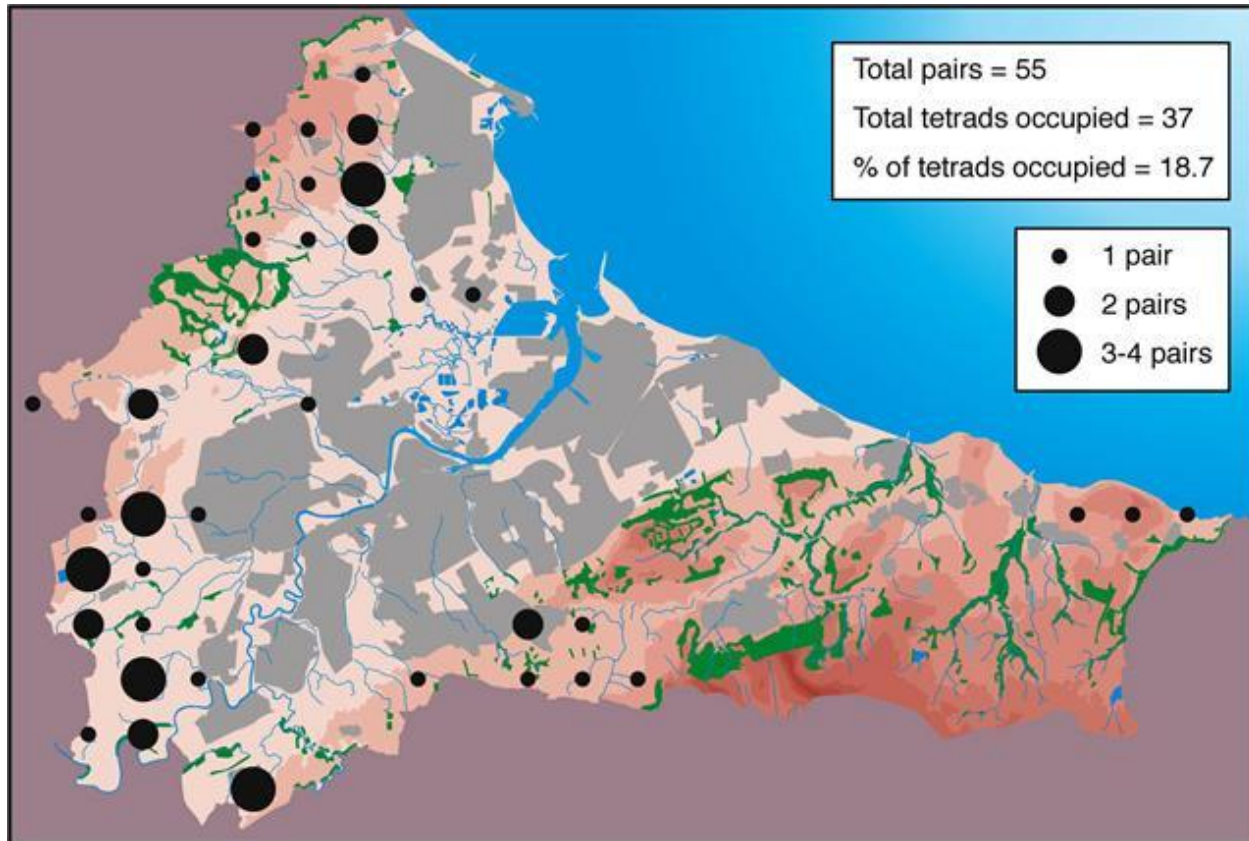
Most Widespread Bird in Cleveland

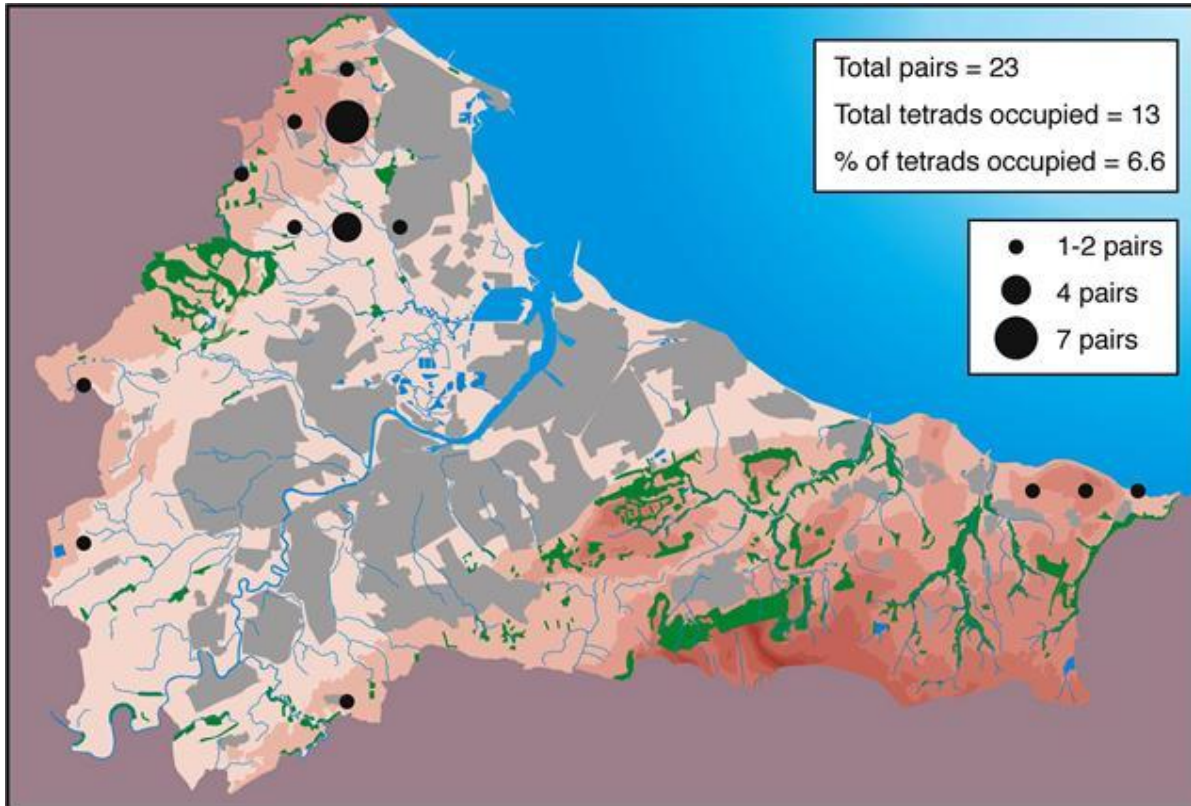

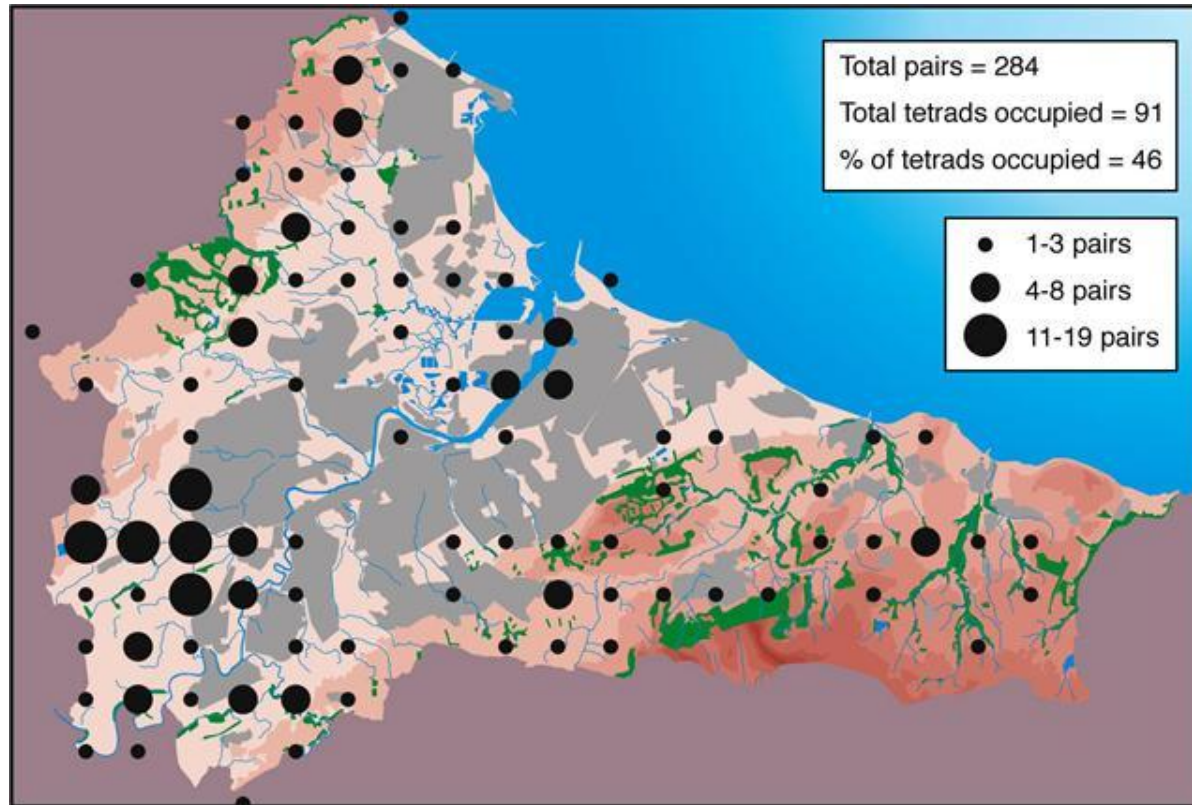


This species benefits greatly from mild winters

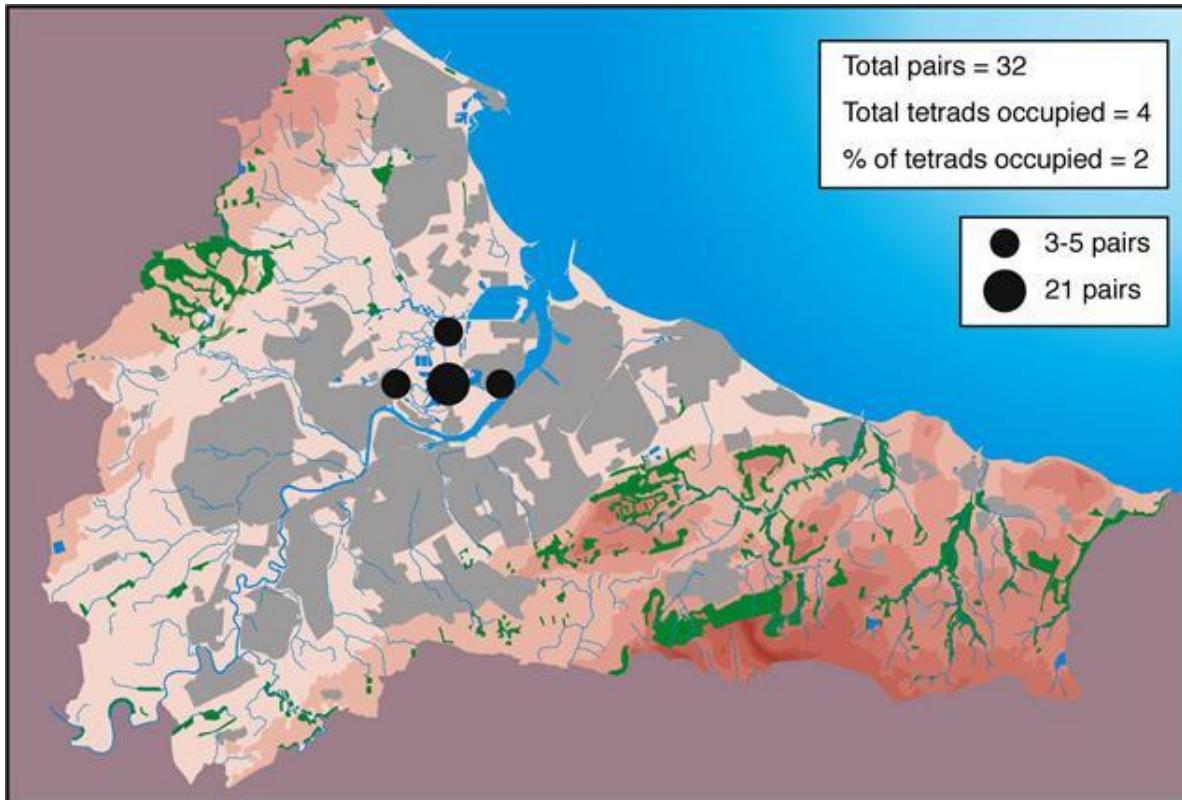
Increased from 1 pair in 1944 to 25 pairs during the survey

Little Egret



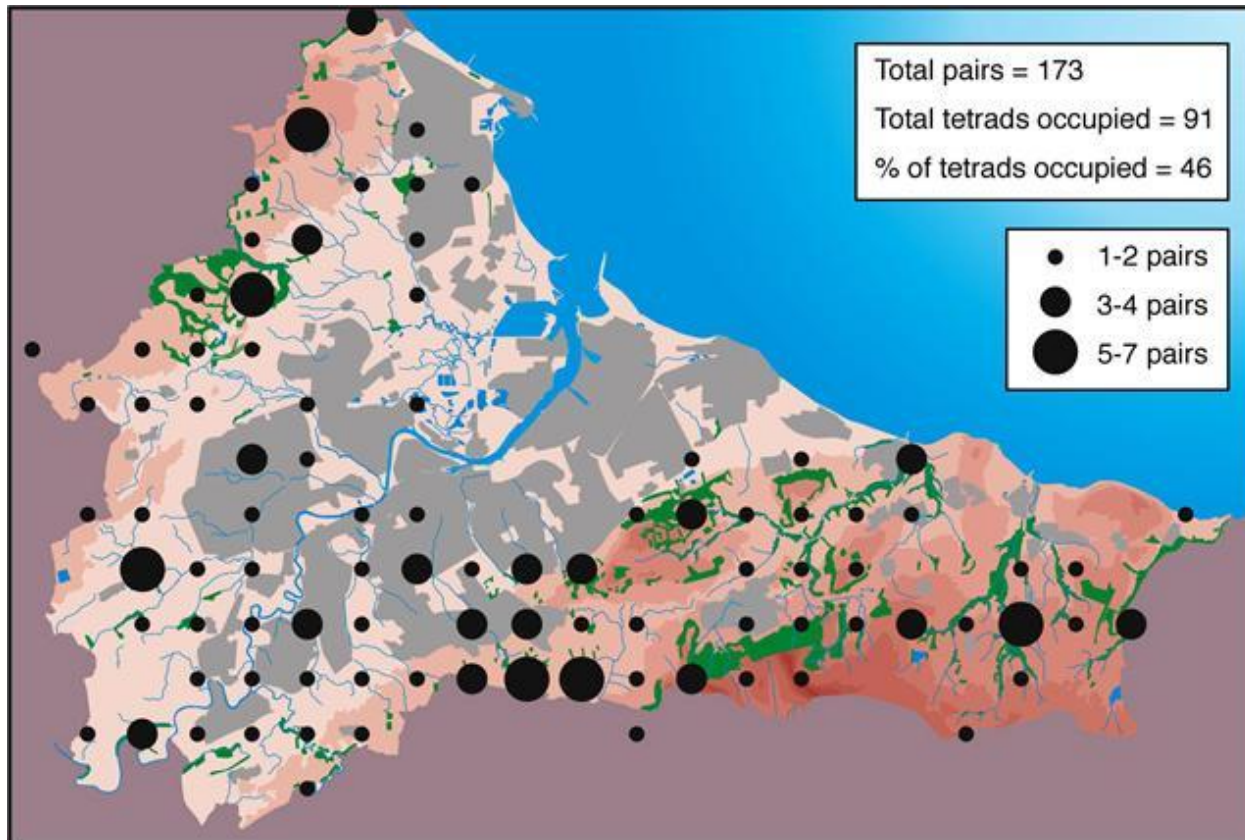
First bred in England in 1996

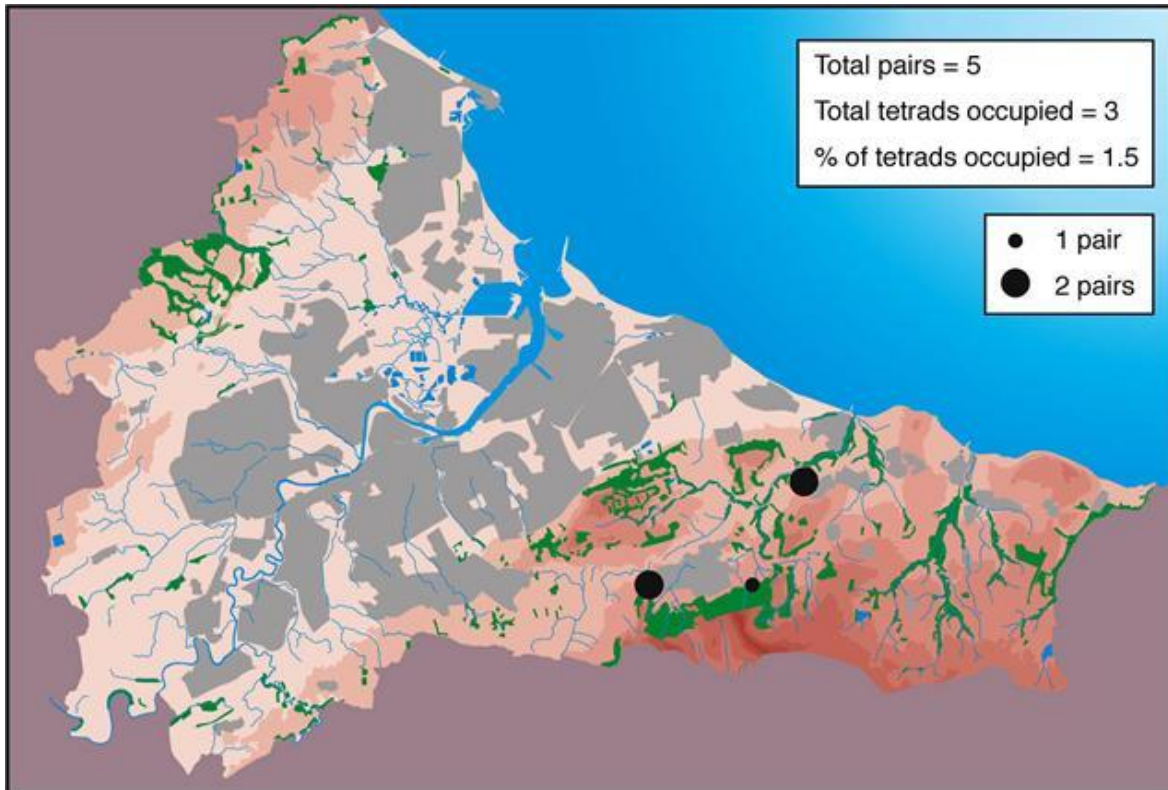

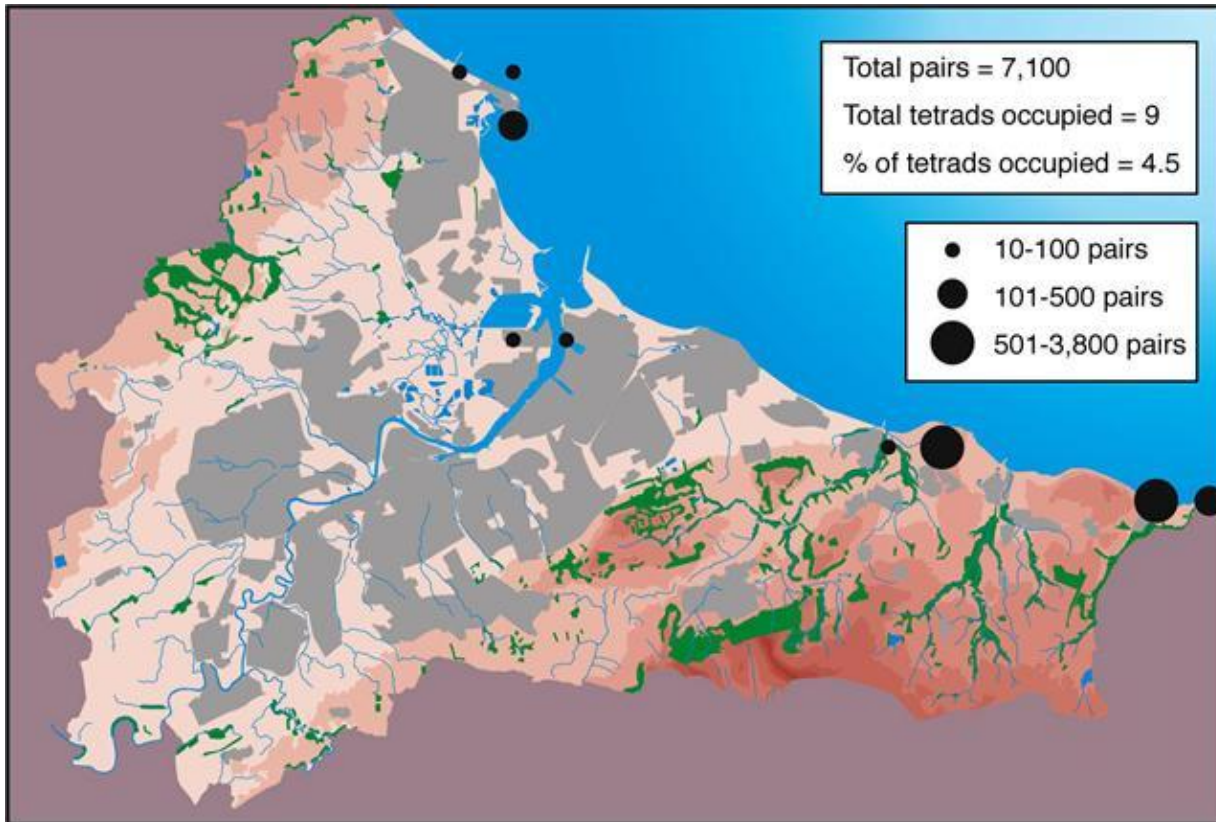
